- 1. I suggest that the in-text be revisited as the initials of the authors were included, which is not appropriate; e.g., P. Lawton should be Lawton (year). Also, S. V. Gunther (1994) should be Gunther (1994).
- 2. The grammar needed to be reworked generally, such as:
- 3. Today, we know a great deal about stress and its management. How? You need to split it.
- 4. Something is known about how older adults manage their aging. However, we know very little about which strategies are persistently chosen by older adults to cope with their aging. This is not clear.
- 5. The references are generally too old; I suggest the author use more recent literature.
- 6. What procedure, design, and sampling technique were used, and what were their justifications for this study? What statistical amylases are used, and why? As it is, the study looks unorganized and lacks future replications.
- 7. Under discussion, authors need to explain using local contents and contexts why their results are the way they are (either similar to or contradicting the results of past literature) and the use of this scale and its shortcomings for future researchers.
- 8. Some sentences in the literature review do not seem to make sense or are left hanging.
- 9. There is a need to review why the statistical tools used were utilized with empirical literature backing.
- 10. The implications of this study for health and psychosocial practices could be discussed briefly too, to add more value to this study and for future reference.
- 11. In the limitations section, one would have expected the author to talk about response biases and the cognitive capacity of the respondents and how these were controlled or not controlled in a survey study like this.
