

Review of: "Donald Davidson's Theory of Action in Relation to Responsibility: Addressing Crisis of Social Development in Africa"

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The paper generally attempted to offer insightful information or an explanation of the causes of Africa's continued underdevelopment and used Donald Davidson's Theory of Action as a basis. Though careful thought was given to the theoretical and logical perspectives to explain the contention, there was little evidence employed to back it up. It is true that other parts of the world have undergone significant change, development, or transformation, yet most African populations still find it difficult to satisfy their most basic requirements on the land up to now. In my opinion, the theoretical arguments alone might not be adequate to explain the causes of social development crisis in Africa, hence the writers should explore beyond that and substantiate their opinions with other additional data sources, if possible. The paper can have a greater impact and make a more substantial contribution to the field if the extra factors listed below are taken into consideration also:

- What is crisis of social development? Why only social development crisis? Within the prevailing political domains, development is a process rather than an outcome that evolves from one state or situation to another over time and that embrace many aspects. To better grasp the concepts of development and underdevelopment, it would be beneficial to provide a succinct definition of each.
- Is it the individual or group action that make unchanging underdevelopment scenario in Africa?
- Blame games have been and are still remain the major hindrance to Africa's transformation -that need to be looked at in detail. Blame games meant to avoid accountability- every government eventually descends to the politics of the previous administration's blame game.
- Although the leaders take the lion share for Africa's underdevelopment, but the society have something to be blamed too also in my view.
