The manuscript entitled "Concentrations of Polychlorinated Naphthalenes in Food and Human Dietary Exposure: A Review of the Scientific Literature" is an interesting account of the progress of research into the levels of PCNs in food.

The way in which the studies are distributed by country is highlighted as a strong point. However, a mention of what is happening in other countries that have not been included should be required. Both tables are also a good summary, but a better comparison could be made if the units of measurement of PCN concentrations were comparable (ng/g, pg/g, ng/kg, and so on). The author could standardise similar measurements and indicate the meaning of acronyms.

It would be interesting if the author could go into more detail about the existing studies on the dietary exposure to PCNs and the need to stress this aspect.

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
