The topic presented is very interesting and the author has explained in detail about plantation agriculture from a normalization perspective. The author has also thoroughly explained the traditional and contemporary agricultural processes so that readers can understand the process of change that is taking place. However, there are a few things that need to be paid attention to to improve the quality of writing where it is necessary to ensure the connection between the abstract, introduction, theoretical study and findings.

In this case, the author needs to do more analysis in the discussing subsection, where normalization theory should be used comprehensively in reviewing conditions in the field. In this case, various important theories must be used to analyze appropriately. In fact, the author has done this, but has not touched on the main substance of normalization theory, such as the use of the morphogenetic approach (which consists of three stages of analysis) or agroextractivism.

In the abstract it is also stated that we will use several approaches other than normalization which have not been clearly explained in papers such as Realist Social Theory
