In general, this is a well-summarized article that touches on the importance and necessity of vector surveillance and monitoring, as well as the monitoring of human activities and education needed to implement the One Health approach.

There are some minor revisions I wrote.

1. The meaning of "To cause a disease, there must be a change in one of the cycles or elements contained in the One Health paradigm" sentence is unclear. While it's true that diseases can occur due to various human activities such as the eradication of natural habitats or wars, diseases can also occur in natural processes depending on the changes in different environmental factors such as ambient temperature, humidity, and precipitation. This should not be ignored.

The literature is sufficient, but the language could be improved a little more.
