

## Review of: "Analysis of Vaginal Candidiasis Prevalence Among Bangladeshi Women in Relation to Menstrual Hygiene and Other Risk Factors: A Cross-Sectional Study"

- 1. The title of the topic focuses on the Analysis of Vaginal Candidiasis Prevalence Among Bangladeshi Women in Relation to Menstrual Hygiene and Other Risk Factors: A Cross-Sectional Study. Surprisingly, the first, second, and third paragraphs of the introduction are not related to menstrual hygiene and risk factors and need to be omitted and rephrased. There is a possibility that these paragraphs were Al-generated.
- 2. The abbreviation RTIs has been frequently used without being well-defined.
- 3. Vaginal candidiasis, most scholars define as not among sexually transmitted diseases and is considered a normal flora. Hence, the entire introduction needs to be rewritten with proper references, as most paragraphs lack them.
- 4. The authors spent a lot of time explaining other types of candidiasis (mucosal, systemic, cutaneous) that were not researched. Hence, there is a need to focus only on vaginal candidiasis for clarity.
- The entire introductory part appears to have been copied and pasted from textbooks.
- 6. Many references in the literature review are old. There is a need to cite references not older than 5 years, unless necessary.
- 7. The methodology sections lack coherence and clarity.
- 8. Most of the data results lack clarity and focus.
- 9. Lastly, the discussion was not well articulated and needs to be rewritten.
