This article is relevant. But I suggest these points below:

1. To research in other fields of knowledge such as the science of religion, theology, and others.
2. Greater historical contextualization is suggested. For example, the first gay Christian community was founded in 1968 by Rev. Troy Perry, in Los Angeles. 3. It is necessary to clarify the concepts of cults, religion, church, and religious movement.
4. It is necessary to explain the limits of the methodology (PRISMA) and clarify them in the abstract and introduction. The period of research must be considered.
5. To review this text (in general). There are ambiguous sentences throughout this manuscript. There are no footnotes for explaining terms.
6. The past tense and passive voice must be used. The present and active voice are used in ethnography (the method of long-term participant-observation). But this paper is not ethnography.
