## Non-amyloid fibrillary glomerulopathy

Non-amyloid fibrillary glomerulopathy (non-amyloid FGP) is a rare cause of glomerulonephritis (GN) characterized by glomerular accumulation of non-amyloid fibrils in the mesangium and the glomerular (and rarely tubular) basement membrane, that mainly presents with renal insufficiency, micro-hematuria and nephrotic range proteinuria. Non-amyloid FGP and immunotactoid glomerulopathy (IT G, see this term) are often grouped together as pathogenetically related diseases.
