These are two distinctly different subjects, with the former being much more specific and seemingly appropriate for an article of this nature. Addressing the legal facets of AI, on the other hand, seems too ambitious a task, and merely listing relevant points does not seem to constitute an original and useful contribution.

If in a possible new version, the authors choose to focus on the use of AI for law, it would then seem useful and feasible to go into detail and describe the tools used today and the consequences of using these tools.
