The argumentative story is not very cohesive; it is necessary to argue it, giving it a consistency that is based on the citation of sources, and that this basis serves to develop the author's interpretations.

There is an almost telegraphic style in the foundations on which the work is based; a greater interpretative depth would be enriching for the article.

On the other hand, methodologically, it is advisable to be more interested in the acceptance criteria of the conceptual areas of the works that have been analyzed. The use of comparative tables, with respect to conceptual areas, increases the scientific value, since the content of the article is rigorous.

The conclusions, based on the aspects studied, could be more ambitious. It must be taken into account that the binomial inheritance versus environment is a theme that has its roots in the 1940s and, since then, there are scholars and theories that have tried to provide a plausible explanation for the development of personality, to which current research contributes by analyzing and shedding light on this evolution.

All of this can be used to give more meaning to the article.
