This article has a lot of promise. The definition of conflict is still ambiguous, though. The lack of clarity on conflict makes it difficult for the reader to determine whether the author is focusing on micro or macro conflict. Having said that, I'm curious as to whether the conflict resolution this article discusses is handled at the micro or macro level. Although the macro and micro are interrelated, they do not view conflict and its resolution in the same ways.

I do concur with the author that there aren't any precise ethical guidelines for intervening in conflict situations. These moral conundrums frequently arise at the macro level when outside interveners are involved.

But when you read the draft essay, you'll see several connections that suggest the author is focusing on macro conflict resolution.

The findings section appears to be a reiteration of the literature review section that came before it. Combining the two portions into one might be the best option.
