## Methods:

- The self-administered pre-piloted questionnaire was not stated in the Abstract.
- Study design to be mentioned in methods as in the abstract [A cross-sectional study].
- · Where is reference number [13] of the study used in Kuwait?
- You mentioned two student cohorts: 1) fifth-year pharmacy students, what about the [Fourth-year students of the Faculty of Pharmacy and Health Sciences at Aiman University were included in the study]?}
- Ethical approval was obtained from the Ethical Committee of the University of Sharjah. What about Ajman University?

## Results:

- The medical and dental students have different collaboration and teamwork. Why are they presented as one student cohort?
- Table 2. Responses of pharmacy and medical/dental students to questions on inter-professional collaboration contained only one question to medical/dental students?
- Table 6. Views of medical and dental students on abilities of pharmacists and barriers to IP collaboration; Why are pharmacists included in a one-sided view?
- Table 7. Association between ethnicity and barriers to IP collaboration. Ethnicity does not relate to WHO Interprofessional Education definitions
