Here are some suggestions to improve the quality of the paper:

- 1. The paper discusses an issue or phenomenon with relatively outdated data. The review presents the problem's phenomenon up to the year 2016, which is 7 years from now. Various other studies that have addressed the same issue may have been conducted by many researchers and should not be overlooked.
- 2. The urgency of the research is not clearly evident. Generally, this could be presented in the background.
- 3. The explanation in the conclusion section of this paper tends to be a summary of the research results, and a comprehensive conclusion from the paper is not yet apparent. The paper's contribution to both scholarly and practical aspects is not clear. Limitations and future research are crucial parts of a study. Scholars will rely on the research findings. After carefully reading the presented paper, I see several limitations if not addressed, the quality of the research may be perceived as declining by other scholars.

Finally, I suggest the author to reorganize the conducted study without disregarding the research that other scholars have done, considering that the case raised is already too old
