- Clearly distinguish between correlation and causation. Highlight which mechanisms are supported by experimental data versus hypotheses. Use a structured evidence-based approach to strengthen credibility and guide clinical translation.
- Identify gaps between mechanistic insights and clinical practice. Propose specific research designs (e.g., longitudinal cohort studies, interventional trials) to validate hypotheses. Highlight potential biomarkers for early detection or therapeutic targets.
