Details on the mosquito control interventions, like regions where they have been implemented, and their impact (if any) on mosquito-borne diseases in Indonesia.
- 2. Please write IRs and CFRs in full. Proposed revision: morbidity or incidence rates, and mortality or case fatality rates.

 No need to add IRS/CFRs since they don't appear again in the article.
- 3. What is the existing framework for coordinating One Health (OH) in Indonesia?
- 4. Have there been any efforts for multi-sectoral collaboration applying OH in Indonesia that can be strengthened? Providing an example of what capacity is in place and gaps that need strengthening could help the reader better contextualize the insights.
- 5. Which Ministries or players are important in OH in Indonesia? Are there any existing OH-related policies, even if still institutionalized in specific Ministries?
- 6. Any success stories from other countries that demonstrate how this collaboration could work in Indonesia?
