

Review of: "[Viewpoint] Vaccination campaigns against Covid-19 may promote vaccine hesitancy toward mostly well-established, safe, and effective vaccines"

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Despite the central message of the article on what is beneficial to vaccine promotion (raw data should be released, further research promoted, and open debate permitted) is solid, to my perspective the incipit is quite far from the specific focus (i.e., the COVID-19 vaccination(s) delivery under a particular emergency constraint), the body text could be better developed as the references are weak or wrong and problematic, and need to be improved. Links included in n. 2, 5 (and 12), 7 go to pages not found; 4 has a new updated link to an errata corrige; 8 and 9 represent only one voice; 14 is a preprint then not peer-reviewed. In the light of these elements, even the basing idea could be correct, so far there are not the proper argumentations in place.
