Authors listed some related studies without feeding readers with the relevance of these studies to the current study. Perhaps, authors failed to relate these studies to the current study.

Authors may try and improve upon the current state of the literature review.

Authors may clarify their research approach, if it is a systematic review, then authors must provide clear systematic strategy they employed to identify and source information for the study.



Other parts of the work, and discussion

I believe authors must provide readers with how they processed the final 49 articles leading to the discussions and findings. At the moment, authors have not clearly briefed readers on how they utilized the sourced data in providing the presented outcomes and findings.
