This review manuscript should also mention the inclusion and exclusion of references used in accordance with the article review guidelines.

I think the risk factors that have been investigated in previous studies are very important to reveal in this review. Especially in each possible area, there are variations in risk that correlate with the level of disease incidence. In addition, the references used will also be more novel because they reveal the risk factors that have played a role in recent years.
