The article has improved considerably compared to the first version. It is clearer, better organized, and easier to read. My suggestions are:

1. Eliminate the reference to Covid-19. It is not relevant to the study or the findings, and it may limit the appeal of the article.
2. Search for similar studies from the past few years. As another reviewer points out, most of the references are quite old. It would be pertinent to know the current status of research into internship programs.
3. You mention qualitative content analysis and the use of NVivo, but the results are couched in quantities. Is something missing?
4. Check one of the references regarding service learning and internships. Are you sure it should be attributed to Miles and Huberman?
