Behaviour Change Intervention Ontology (BCIO)

Definition: A in terms of the outcomes resulting from achieving a goal.

Comment: Consequences can be either positive or negative. Belief about consequences of goal attainment is about what types of outcomes will be achieved, rather than the value or the likelihood of these outcomes. For instance, a person may believe that studying every night will help achieve good grades. However, the value of achieving such grade may vary, and would fall under 'evaluative belief'.

Ontological definitions can sometimes be hard to read. In those cases we also include an informal definition.

Definitions also often require elaboration to make it clear how they should be used and what they include. In those cases we include a comment.

Also, definitions sometimes require an explanation as to how they came about to help users understand how they relate to alternative definitions. In those cases we include a curator note.
