

Review of: "[Review] Redefining the Concept of e-Government Program. A Review of the Literature"

A study whose goal is a critical analysis of the contemporary definition of the E-government phenomenon and the proposal of its own concept is the main content of the presented article. The abstract is factual, clear and informative. The intention and goal of the presented study is clear, but relatively ambitious. From the literature review, it does not appear convincingly that the author analyzes the state of the art thoroughly, and the author's good orientation in the monitored issue is thus not completely proven. The proposal for an innovative definition of E-Government is valuable. However, it is not entirely clear from the Proposed Conceptual Framework for E-Government section on the basis of which findings the actual proposal was formulated and created. The description of each of the six proposed concepts is very brief, even wordy. There is a lack of logical connection and a thorough explanation and justification of the significance and validity of the proposed concepts. The author is aware of the relatively fundamental limitations of the research framework of the study and draws attention to them. However, even somewhat superficial desk research underlines the study's limitations. The discussion is rather vague. Overall, it is an insufficiently developed and appropriately presented article that does not make a significant contribution to the current state of the art.
