- The article discusses an important topic.
- The novelty of the research is clearly stated in the manuscript.
- The title of the study expresses clearly what the article is about.
- The topic and the research questions presented by the authors are clear and appropriate for the current study.
- The research design and methods are appropriate for the research questions.

## Constructive feedback

- The abstract section should not exceed a maximum of 300 words. The abstract is very lengthy and goes into detailed
  accounts best suited for the article's introduction section. It is recommended that the author reduce the abstract
  section.
- Important points that should be in the abstract include the purpose of bringing the topic, the subject matters, how you
  conducted the study, the research design, the instruments, how you collected and analyzed the data, the results and
  conclusions, and the implications of the study.
- In the Discussion section, you need to compare your results or findings with findings in previous research. Are there any differences? Are there any new insights? Is there any consistency, and so on?
- Many references are too old. Find newer sources that were published within a maximum of 10 years backward. If a
  reference is a grand theory, try to support this theory with articles on relevant topics published more recently.
