- 1. The authors should also state the pooled prevalence of antibiotic use generally and use without prescription to increase generalizability.
- 2. In the second paragraph, "... the percentage of antibiotics prescribed per patient encounter."

The authors should be clear what this terminology means.

There is "number of antibiotics prescribed per patient encounter," as well as "percentage of patient encounters with antibiotics prescribed," i.e., percentage of encounters in which an antibiotic was prescribed.
