Review Assessment

Thank you for the opportunity to review the manuscript entitled "Associations between transactional leadership and safety climate among 314 Pakistani nurses during COVID-19 pandemic: moderating roles of transformational leadership". The manuscript addressed an interesting subject, still I have some concerns that should be considered:

- 1. Although the author (s) use poll evidence to support the need of stressors in the introduction, it merely serves to support the research issue, with no evidence to support the significance or requirement of the research content. The rest of the section is unclear on the research's importance and significance. In addition, the author (s) emphasizes the importance and present state of the context of a developing country rather than the theories context.
- 2. Literature review part has reviewed a large number of extant literatures. However, it is necessary to summarize the research blanks or more clearly point out the relationship with your research, indicating that it is meaningful to choose these literatures to review. author (s) should clarify and justify why these are happened. Please consider the following references:

Further explanation about, the data collection section needs to address the data collection technique/s, how the data were collected, what methods and mechanisms were used to obtain the data, how was the sample selected, how representative the sample is if it is. Why 486 interviewees not more or less the author (s) should justify that!
- 5. Importantly, how did the author (s) treat the CMV? Before and after the data collection procedures.
- 6. In the part of discussion and conclusion, the author (s) spent a lot of time sorting out the research findings and practical implications. The description of the part of theoretical implications is more like the research conclusions. I do not find the theoretical contribution of the research to the existing research field. I think it is necessary for the author (s) to add and highlight the theoretical implications, and the discussion of the results should be as simple and clear as possible.
- 7. Please also make sure to articulate your contribution (or how your paper advances knowledge in this field) both in the Introduction and in the Conclusion and the novelty of your paper and implications for future research. Kindly also make sure to highlight the practical implications of your research from the perspective of organizations and managers, as well as policymakers in more depth.
