Abstract:

Text:

- You might implement the text with new findings, clinical trials, or treatment of CMV.

- You might add some references to the bibliography to better describe sentences that you write in the text (i.g. "Approximately 90% of primary CMV infections in individuals who are immunocompetent, according to studies, are asymptomatic" or "Studies in pathology and epidemiology point to a direct connection between CMV and atherosclerosis". What studies you are referring to?)
- You might add an "Epidemiology" chapter and give some numbers of the virus.
- You might add some figures or tables to better describe the statements in the text. They will be very helpful in the reading of the review.
