

## Review of: "Financial Repercussions of Carbon Emissions and Depletion of Natural Resources: The Role of Fiscal Policy in Determining Health Expenditures"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

After reading through, the following issues were identified:

- 1. The abstract is not well-written. It should be re-written following the typical pattern of abstract: the objective/purpose of study; scope; methodology; results/findings; and recommendations.
- 2. The background/introduction to the study is missing.
- 3. The review of relevant empirical literature is inadequate.
- 4. The section entitled "Global patterns of health expenditure and environmental conditions" is more of a "stylised fact" rather than literature review.
- 5. **Methodology**: No model was specified. Moreover, there are no theoretical and empirical support for the models and the control variables incorporated.
- 6. The rationale for using PLS was not provided. Why PLS and not Mean Group, Pooled Mean Group, or GMM, etc.
- 7. **Empirical Findings:** No preliminary estimations? Not descriptive statistics, correlation analysis, unit root tests, and cross-sectional dependence tests, amongst other. How do we know whether the data used are adequate for empirical analysis.
- 8. The results were just interpreted. There was not disscussion whatsoever on the implications of the findings.
- 9. I am not comfortable with the analysis. Why PLS? Given the limitations of the technique, I think the use of other approaches for consistency and robustness test would have increased the confidence in the results generated.
- 10. Policy Implications: No policy implication was given. Conclusion is also missing.

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
