

Review of: "A Survey: Looking for the best possible way of modern engagement with Traditional Indian knowledge"

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The paper seems to me an interesting one but it's coverage is not broad and limited only to the Physical Sciences. It would have been better if the author could include the case of Social Sciences in India, particularly Anthropology. I am an anthropologist, so I can tell in some detail on this subject. There were at least three kinds of self-reflection by the Indian anthropologists, namely, colonial, Hindu and nationalist. I post four articles for the author to have an overall idea on the subject. I also post two articles, one on a famous anthropologist, who started his career in Physics but later turned to anthropology and other a personal account of an Indian anthropologist who studied Indian culture and society but stayed in USA. Reading of self-reflexive texts of the scientists should be combined along with the questionnaire. Neither Physics nor Anthropology are exceptions. Finally, I post a recent article, which provided a comprehensive historical account of Anthropology in India.

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
