

Review of: "Public Health Care Leadership Competencies Through the Lens of the COVID-19 Pandemic: A Review of What Matters in Managing Global Health Crisis"

This review article, specifically devoted to search for the competencies required for an effective leadership in managing global health crises, is relevant and interesting. The narrative is good and very clear. I submit to the Author's consideration three remarks and suggestions.

First, the literature reviewed is too biased towards the American and Asian experience. What about the European experience where new organizational models have been adopted during the Pandemic to cope with the crisis?

Second, the paper correctly indicates the relevance of the "collaboration" between governments, corporations, third sector entities. However, the proper word to be used is cooperation, not collaboration, since it postulates the principle of subsidiarity.

Third, I would suggest to expand somewhat the "Conclusion" section to suggest ways ahead for future research. Actually, at p. 14 there are some indications pointing to this. I would urge the Author to elaborate at least a bit. After all, leadership is certainly important, but it is not the only strategic element.
