Some references cannot be accessed, such as 2, 3, and 4, which are extremely important. Regarding the references, many of them are from proceedings rather than peer-reviewed journals.

The text proposes an innovative study in a controversial area. The methodology suggested by the study seems appropriate; however, I am unable to replicate the study due to my technical limitations and time constraints. Therefore, I would recommend distributing the algorithm through virtual repositories such as GitHub, facilitating access to information for future enthusiasts of the topic.

The low sample size also concerns me. In addition, there is inadequate description of the ethics committee to which the study was submitted. Every study involving humans must necessarily undergo an ethics committee review, even if it is for the use of photos.

I see potential in the presented data, but I remain skeptical about the aura. Unfortunately, I find myself not qualified to evaluate the results.
