- What is "hour of openness to air" it should explain clearly.
- In the result part, most of the data same as from the abstract. I could not see much more detail from it.
- As a result;
  - Who tested the healthcare workers for skin related health issues.
  - If no professional has tested it and the participants self-declared their skin problems due to personal protective equipment, this will cast a shadow over the objectivity of the study.
