I can partially agree with this commentary.

I believe Kienböck's disease begins with venous stasis. But I don't think that only drainage of the joint will help the symptoms, and I think that puncture, or drilling, of the lunate itself would be effective. The Ogawa procedure(1) may help support and prove this idea.

Nevertheless, we believe this type of commentary is important.

The following is my minor suggestion.

Throughout the paper, "lunate bone" should be changed to "lunate".
