

## Review of: "A Policy Dialogue for Nutrition of Women and Adolescent Girls: Sustainable Development Goals Matters Arising"

The policy dialogue addresses an important issue: the nutrition of women and adolescent girls in Rwanda. There are several issues the authors need to address to improve the presentation of the Policy Dialogue. Details are provided below:

- I suggest a slight modification of the title as follows: "A Policy Dialogue for the Nutrition of Women and Adolescent
  Girls in Rwanda." This is a more appropriate title because the contents of the dialogue describe the nutritional status of
  women and adolescent girls in Rwanda and the need for interventions.
- 2. There is a need for a brief description of Rwanda (population, place of women, etc.) to enable readers to understand the context of the country.
- 3. Although references were provided, there are no citations in the text; I suggest that the authors provide in-text citations to enable readers to match and verify the information provided.
- 4. The Call for Action should be country-specific; the authors should describe individuals and agencies in Rwanda that will be responsible for implementing the activities suggested.
- 5. The meaning of all acronyms cited in the dialogue should be clearly defined; for example, what does SBC stand for?

  This should be clarified.
- 6. In the conclusion, the authors mentioned 'the study'; however, no information was provided on the procedures or results of such a study. This should be revised.
