Discussing about international education from the Chinese parents' perspective is very relevant to the field. However, I would like to point out 03 pillars that may guide you to improve your writing. Please, consider other peer reviewers' comments as well.

Theoretical basis – Scientific literature is based on reading and studying different content. To find this source I advise you to consult a Librarian regarding the databases and other information sources related to the main topics of the article. Although the paper refers to the process/steps that Chinese parents guide their sons and daughters when choosing a destiny to study abroad, it is necessary to have a reading list based on quality and use it as a reference in the field of study. The article is not based on scientific evidence, the way it was written - there are no citations or authors mentioned. The reference list comes from the same authors, mostly. Please, check here before reviewing the **Theoretical background**.

Methodology – what was the methodology used to write the paper? This is essential in scientific writing. John W. Creswell and Vicki L. Plano Clark are excellent authors that you can use as a start to understanding it. However, check other books that clarify how to apply/choose the right methodology in the research process. It includes the article and abstract as well.

Critical thinking/writing/reviewing/feedback/final version – After selecting and studying your reading list write your point of view on a blank paper and make drafts. Correlates the reading list to your first ideas. Keep writing. Make sure you mention different authors connecting to your points of view. It is not about giving your opinion while writing at the first moment. It is about connecting to science and stating what agrees and disagrees on certain topics – this is just an example. Make sure you are following the Methodology. Academic writing has a lot of analytical thinking. Ask for feedback, but consider selecting what you will accept and not. Critical thinking is developed through practicing and consulting good mentors.

Your text is pleasant to read and stating the main topics to take into account starting each paragraph guides the reader in the section "Choosing the Most Suitable Study Destination". Although, after following the steps above the structure of the article may change. You will probably extend the conclusion in more detail, as well.
