To improve the quality of the work, there needs to be more focus and apparent justification of why the study's attempt to revisit the Moi Era of Kenya's Middle East relations is essential. It is also crucial to clarify the method used for the study and the scope of comparison. In foreign policy analysis, quantitative and straightforward analytical approaches are preferred for systematic studies of comparativists (more than one country). If this study aims to update Kenya's relations with its Middle East partners, it should explain why the Moi era is significant and how the present update relates to it. Additionally, the editing quality of the language needs improvement.
