However, minor comments are important to clarify:

Regarding the language: the study follows the old British school of English, in which some terms look different for understanding by the readers, so I suggest simplifying some of these terms.

The title reveals the article as an article review, although it was represented as if it were a systematic review, in which each has its different entity.

Is the PRISMA chart specific to a systematic review? If it is, represent the PRISMA chart as such; it is not well written or organized.

Most of the subheadings and the figures' captions are not fully informative, so rewrite to be clear for readers without referring to the text.

Regarding the studies analyzed in this article, there are no citations about them or any referral to them. So, where is the database of these studies if I would like to refer to any?

The discussion section looks like a conclusion and lacks supporting references.

Only 8 references for the whole study?? Plus, there is a lack of in-text citations.
