Peer Review Report:

Article: "The Changing Trajectory of COVID-19 and How Immunity is Evolving with It"

General Comments:

The article presents interesting findings; however, my primary concern is the academic writing style. The abstract should be rewritten, and if the journal does not require a structured abstract, it would be better to split it into background, aim, method, results, and conclusion. Keywords should also be reformulated to avoid duplication with the title while using Mesh-type keywords. The introduction needs to be reorganized, as there is a lot of redundancy. I recommend splitting it into three parts: what is known, unknown aspects, and the aim of the study. The content of the article is generally good, but I have concerns about a particular reference. The authors should highlight that the declaration of COVID-19 as no longer a global health emergency is a step forward toward it becoming endemic. Furthermore, I highly recommend that the authors read and cite articles that are in line with their study.

Specific Comments:

- 1. Abstract: I suggest rewriting the abstract and, if possible, structuring it into separate sections such as background, aim, method, results, and conclusion. This would provide a clearer overview of the article's content.
- 2. Keywords: It would be beneficial to reformulate the keywords to avoid duplication with the title, especially when using Mesh-type keywords.
- 3. Introduction: The introduction needs to be reorganized and rephrased to reduce redundancy. I recommend dividing it into three parts: what is known, unknown aspects, and the aim of the study. This will provide a clearer structure and flow to the introduction.
- 4. Important Reference: The authors should highlight the significance of the declaration of COVID-19 as no longer a global health emergency, as it represents a step forward in the transition of COVID-19 into an endemic disease. This information should be emphasized in the article.
- 5. Additional References: I strongly recommend that the authors read and cite articles that are directly related to their study.
