Through this review column, I personally appreciate the author's step to try to elaborate on the perspective of human rights in development as an original thought. The aspects referred to in this article actually look at the dynamics of human rights on development. However,

However, this article is still far from what is expected as a publishable-level article, so criticism is directed at the following context:

- 1. It is not appropriate to be specific only to Perpres 120/2022; instead, it must be elaborative with development policies, especially infrastructure related to the dimensions of human rights.
- 2. This article does not yet have the depth of analysis in relation to human rights over development, so it is not yet comprehensive in its depth on the issues addressed by the author.
- 3. The lack of clarity of methodology makes the analysis confusing, which tends to stick to the normative dogmatic level rather than using macro-micro research patterns, quantitative-qualitative research, or empirical-normative research with sociolegal implications. This triggers confusion in the study of the article.
- 4. The lack of sources cited in the whole article, and the comparison in the state of the art encourage this article to still not have a clear, streamlined article on the issue of human rights over development.
