

Review of: "How Well Are We Protecting Human Research Subjects?"

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The article is a necessary contribution to the debate on the guarantee they have. As the author explains, this topic was widely discussed, but to this day, it is not clear how much damage is actually experienced by participants in research on human beings.

The author's proposal to compare performance metrics of the protection of research subjects in humans is novel and may offer opportunities to improve the protection of research subjects in humans.

However, perhaps the adequate magnitude of the text used in the revision of the historical analysis of the phenomenon and the magnitude of the text used in the interesting proposals made by the author are unbalanced. It should be noted that it is not suggested to reduce the historical treatment of the topic, but to further develop the proposal for comparison between metrics.
