The authors conducted a study titled "Neuropsychiatric and Social Consequences of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder in Females" and it is thought that they drew attention to an important issue. It is thought that the article will be more efficient by making some edits related to the article.

General comments

- 1-When the general course of the article was examined, it was observed that numerical data were not used in conveying information. This may lead to misinterpretation of what is written (for example, the sentence "Some ADHD females might compensate in early adult life through maladaptive coping strategies such as acting out or behaving in ways that are perceived as socially inappropriate").
- 2-Care should be taken to ensure that the cited article and the data cited in that article are compatible (for example, "In the article cited for the sentence "Fibromyalgia is a common complication of ADHD in females", I could not find information that fibromyalgia is a complication in ADHD).

Specific comments

- 1-Abstract can be extended to cover the whole article. It can be reorganized to better express the main theme.
- 2- In the article where the co-occurrence of ADHD and Autism is reported to be up to 86%, it is stated as 0-86%, but the idea that writing only 86% may mislead the reader.

It should be noted that the examples we have given in the commentary are for a better understanding of the commentary and that more than the examples we have given in the text should be noted.
