- include more bibliographical sources to support the initial background
- -a possible limit is given by the sample analysed, as it is mainly made up of a single profession (nurses). This could be a source of possible bias as the study population is not balanced
- I believe it is important that the educational role of nurses on issues such as nutrition is underlined, but not of other healthcare professionals as their professional profile is not made up of these skills (physiotherapists, dentists).
- -The ethical approval number is not indicated
- -I agree with the authors on the implementation of nutritional training for the correct provision of nutrition education.

I invite the authors to make these changes and to expand the limits section with the suggestions given.
