My review of this manuscript with specific attention to the literature, methodology, analysis, discussion and conclusion points to the author's scholarly 'due diligence' in attending to the relevant components. The author's knowledge of the extant literature relative to the subject matter, use of evidence to buttress claims, acceptable display of contextual knowledge and attendant praxis among others are commendable. The study's model serves as a good depiction of the conceptual essence with related relevant analytical aspects. My only suggestion is for the author to avoid starting paragraphs with conjunctive adverbs because doing so somewhat complicates logicalness/flow, especially if claims, reason, and evidence sequence is taking into consideration. Thus, the author should consider minor fixes to those paragraphs that commence with conjunctive adverbs. I will recommend acceptance once the minor fixes are made. This manuscript/paper is likely to serve as a good addition to knowledge and praxis in collaborative public management-not only at the country level, but at the regional and continental levels as well (Africa to be specific).
