

Review of: "The Imperative of a Comprehensive One Health Approach for Mosquito-Borne Disease Control in Indonesia"

The study tackles an important subject and advocates for a multidisciplinary approach towards mosquito-borne disease control in Indonesia. However, the review describes a generic One Health approach, lacking specificity to the local context in Indonesia.

The paper could be strengthened if control strategies used in Indonesia are analysed in each of the described sections (Interconnectedness of Human, Animal, and Environmental Health, Community engagement and health education, Cross-sector collaboration and policy implementation), to accurately assess which key areas require imperative focus for a sustainable and effective One Health program.

The paper is also lacking sufficient references, especially in certain instances where statistics are quoted. The article should aim to provide a clear methodology, research questions, and present review results in a graphical/systematic manner. Limitations and future areas of investigation should also be detailed in the discussion.

Overall, the study provides a concise perspective on laying the foundation for a One Health approach to mosquito-borne disease control, which could be enhanced with a detailed and critical evaluation of specific control practices in Indonesia.
