In the very beginning, please describe better what e-learning is and what it entails (mention hybrid learning and hyflex as options that include it too).

Any citations are missing throughout. You have a reference list, but you neglect to insert citations within the body of your article. This must be fixed.

The literature review is written like a bulleted format, as opposed to a true scholarly work. Please fix.

Other issues to mention in the opening is lack of support and funding from the educational system, and parental issues (lack of support at home).

Your article could be more thorough and include more information. It is interesting but it is brief and has no subheadings.

Method section: "A statistical method was used"...need to be more specific. Qualitative analysis? How did you recruit/select the person? Why? Did you use an informed consent? Ethical approval? etc. Who was selected? Their demographics? Why? Your methodology section needs to be expanded beyond 2 sentences.

This is confusing...you say it's a "case study" but then you say it was a survey sent to many students at 4 institutions. Which was it? A case study or quantitative survey research study? Were their interviews? Qualitative? Mixed methods? Were there only 2 questions on the survey? That's the extent of what you mention in the results section.

This is an important topic of research and I encourage you to continue with it, but you need to fix this article to include citations, more thorough information about the topic and especially about your research study and what kind of research it was. The methods section is very lacking as well. If you add to all of this and better explain what kind of research study this was and what it entailed and elaborate on the findings, this could be an important article. Good luck.
