This kind of idea develop on this work appears interesting; the use of a confident and safe epidural fluoroguided infiltration can be a good technique with low risk peri and post procedure.

The fluoroguided only approach to the epidural space is described as feasible.

The article is lacking in some aspects:

- Some passages are not fully clarified (for example, the contralateral oblique vision technique).
- the statistical part is unnecessarily complex, correct from the methodological point of view, but it could have been more linear with more easy tests, even if one understands the difficulty of comparing results with high/complete success rates.
- the references should be re-edited looking for greater coherence (ref 18 authors underlined)
- the tone of the text appears excessively colloquial;
- there are no fluoroscopic images.
