

Review of: "The Complexity of Leaving No One Behind: Unmasking and Emphasizing Multiple and Intersectional Marginalisation in India"

The article has taken interesting analysis of using MPI and mapping the districts. However, there is little discussion on made on how the analysis can help in reconsidering development approaches to meet SDGs. It makes multiple emphasis on intersectional marginalization, and it would be nice to have specific examples in the article. Otherwise, the article bears an impression of being brief and general.

The conclusion (written in "Revisiting intersecting margins" should have more thorough discussion to avoid the recommendations being made sound too much jumping into conclusion.

The paper mentions the number of districts in India to be 640. I think some districts were not included in analysis. The discrepancies with actual number of districts (above 700 I think) should be explained early in the paper.

Some editing is also required as marginalization seems to be wrongly elled here and there.
