The article utilizes relevant literature and cites interesting findings. Overall, I would recommend focusing on a specific group of students and describing their experiences with cheating (methods) and the penalties involved (such as academic warnings, probation, etc.). The presented text is quite broad, opening up many topics. Are there disciplinary committees at universities, high schools, or primary schools in Poland? How frequently is cheating addressed? What types of cheating are involved (plagiarism, cheating on tests, using mobile phones, etc.)?

Recommendation: The text would benefit from a more specific focus on a particular group of students.
