Review of: "The LLM Productivity Cliff: Threshold Productivity and AI-Native Inequality"

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I really enjoyed the concept of “productivity cliffs”; it’s a fresh and interesting way to think about how we use AI tools. The article makes some great points about the importance of architectural literacy and workflow design. That said, some of the language felt a bit heavy with technical jargon such as “architectural literacy,” “step-change gains,” and “mental model alignment,” which made it harder to follow at times. A few simpler explanations or real-world examples would make the ideas much easier to digest. It’s a solid write-up with a lot of value; I just think it could connect with more readers if it were written in clearer and more reader-friendly explanations.
