- 1-There are still some minor grammatical and punctuation errors in the text, which need to be corrected.
- 2-It is not advisable to cite Wikipedia as a source in academic work.
- 3-It is advisable to update bibliographic references, particularly in the section "2.1. Scenario of Old informal settlements in India".
- 4-It is recommended to use more recent data than 2011 for the census, especially in the section "Background and Context".



5-There are problems with the figures, including missing titles or sources, as well as a mix-up between titles and sources in most cases (Figure 2, Figure 3, Figure 4, Figure 5).

These points deserve particular attention in order to improve the quality and clarity of your article before publication. We encourage you to take them into account in your revision.
