

Review of: "The Birth Satisfaction Scale: Igbo adaptation, validation, and reliability study"

The article was well written. However, I will like to draw the attention of the authors to a few things.

1. In some instances, authors used fractions, e.g., two-thirds, three-fourths, for quantifications; please replace with percentages or put the percentages in parenthesis.
2. The formula used to determine the sample size should be stated, explained, and referenced.
3. Under the descriptions of sample size, study instrument, and scoring, please use past tenses. For instance, "They will be interviewed using" should read "were interviewed using."
4. To make it more explanatory, the BSS-R (under scoring) should be tagged as a table and captioned, "Table 1: Description of BSS-R" or something related as the authors deem fit.
5. Still under scoring, instead of saying "The BSS-R comprises the following three subscales," I am of the opinion that it should be referred to as Table 2 and captioned: Subscales of the BSS-R."
6. If 4 and 5 are accepted, cite Tables 1 and 2 in the text.
7. The article needs some grammatical editing.
