The article was well written. However, I will like to draw the attention of the authors to a few things.

- 1. In some instances, authors used fractions, e.g., two-thirds, three-fourths, for quantifications; please replace with percentages or put the percentages in parenthesis.
- 2. The formula used to determine the sample size should be stated, explained, and referenced.
- 3. Under the descriptions of sample size, study instrument, and scoring, please use past tenses. For instance, "They will be interviewed using" should read "were interviewed using."
- 4. To make it more explanatory, the BSS-R (under scoring) should be tagged as a table and captioned, "Table 1: Description of BSS-R" or something related as the authors deem fit.
- 5. Still under scoring, instead of saying "The BSS-R comprises the following three subscales," I am of the opinion that it should be referred to as Table 2 and captioned: Subscales of the BSS-R."
- 6. If 4 and 5 are accepted, cite Tables 1 and 2 in the text.
- 7. The article needs some grammatical editing.
